

<p>Transfer activities with the tourism industry (with selected examples)</p>	<p>Different activities are organized to connect the university and its lecturers, researchers and students to stakeholders from the tourism sector, including companies (SMEs) and destination management organisations. The focus is on SMEs and on rural areas.</p> <p>Internship and also a practical course called “Project in Multidisciplinary Teams” during which students elaborate practical sustainability solutions in close cooperation with industry partners is an integral part of the curriculum. For example, this year’s students are working with several organizations devoted to expand sustainability on the island and abroad. In some particular cases, they support different local entrepreneurial projects as well.</p>
